

Private BMW Collection... A tour on 9/30

The day trip to see Chris Aher's collection of old BMWs was a great success.

Everyone who started out from OurWAWA made it to the nondescript building in Mount Holly with several others arriving either earlier or later than our main group.

The range of BMWs displayed (and a few other interesting bikes like the Victoria and Marushos) was nothing short of spectacular.

Chris' collection included over 50 bikes, mostly BMWs and mostly pre 1960. We had coffee and donuts the warehouse/lounge area where later we enjoyed a super presentation on how he got started (very few years ago) and how he pursues his passion. (By the way, Chris said that his first BMW was a GS which got him hooked and fueled his passion toward older models.)

The first bike that greets you as you enter the large high-ceiling air conditioned warehouse is not a BMW... but a pristine 1921 Victoria.



Another unique bike located in the front of the building was a BMW labeled K50. It definitely presented its vintage BMW frame/tank etc but with a strange 4-cyl engine. It appeared to be a VW air cooled engine mated to the old bike transmission. Carbs and exhausts were unusual even for an old VW engine.

One thing our host asked - that we please NOT

post photos taken at the site to websites or even Instagram or other web environments. The location where the photos were taken can be easily determined from the EXIF data that is part of every JPG taken on your phone. It uses the GPS on your phone to geo-locate the photo.

An independent review of the New Goldwings and the BMW K1600 GTL and Bagger

Metuchen Powersports which has the BMW and the Honda was awesome today they let me ride four bikes. All bikes for 2019.

The first was the Honda Goldwing F6 Speed. Overall great ride plenty of power, lots of fun, great features, and very responsive. With about 125 hp. I give this bike a rating of four speeding tickets out of five.



My second was the BMW K1600 GTL. 6 Speed. Overall OK, plenty of power, lots of fun, great features, and very responsive. With about 175 hp. I give this bike a rating of THREE speeding tickets out of five. This bike at the 100 mile-an-hour speed did not feel good. Maybe better with a second Passenger not sure.



My third test ride was back to the Honda Goldwing Touring DCT. I had never ridden a DCT before, this was very interesting. Only a little learning curve and the sport mode had plenty of get-up-and-go. Overall great ride plenty of power, lots of fun, great features, and very responsive. With about 125 hp. I feel a new rider could master this bike very quickly. I give this bike a rating of four speeding tickets out of five.



Lastly, I returned to the BMW K1600 B (Bagger) 6 Speed. Overall excellent ride plenty of power, lots of fun, great features, and very responsive. With about 175 hp. The bagger not only looks BADASS, it sounds like a damn indy car and moves like one as well! I give this bike five speeding tickets out of five!



Sept 30th - Private Viewing

On September 30, a bunch of members of Jersey Shore BMW Riders and New Sweden BMW met at a secret location near Mt Laurel, NJ to view a private BMW museum. The Jersey Shore people mostly arrived on motorcycles, having ridden from our meeting place at "Our Wawa", which is near Great Adventure.



The museum is owned by Chris Aker, who has done well for himself in an internet business. He started out as a "sport biker", but fell in love with vintage BMWs as a result of a visit to Barber Vintage Festival. (The Barber Vintage Festival is held every October on the museum grounds/race track that Barber built outside of Birmingham, AL. Attendence is expected to be about 75,000 this year.)

Chris went from a "go fast" guy to a "thrill of the acquisition" guy when he switched focus from rid-

ing sport bikes to collecting vintage BMWs. He has nearly achieved his dream of having one of each model from the first 50-odd years of BMW motorcycle production.



The bikes in his collection are mostly restored. Chris said that he restored just one of them, so he's had to chase down obscure parts from around the world. Chris also said that he doesn't like to ride the bikes in his collection, for, in his words, "they suck". By this he meant that the motors and suspensions are marginal and the brakes are worse. Chris feels that he is just the "current owner", whose job is to preserve this history for the next generation to appreciate.

Chris is interested in showing his collection to other groups (we were the first non-friends and family group to see the collection). So if you are involved with other groups that might appreciate 50 old BMWs, contact Chris (or contact the me and I'll pass on his contact information).

Chris is quite rightly somewhat paranoid about having a million dollars or more of old motorcycles in a warehouse, so he requests that visitors not post pictures of his collection on social media.

He's worried that the "geo-tagging" done by smart phones and some cameras will cause the exact GPS coordinates of his warehouse to become public knowledge.

When I took my photos, I turned off the "geo-tagging" feature of my smartphone. There are also apps that allow one to strip the meta-data from photo files, should you not want to change the phone settings but still want to post pictures online.

If you need help doing this on your phone – bring it to the meeting this month!


