

Joe Karol reported on our treasury - which is healthy (over \$1,600 - and more membership renewals in the works.)

Jim Thomasey reported that about 35 members (out of 60+) had renewed for 2019.

RDS gave us an update on the Holiday Party - and it was voted that the cost per paid member/significant other was to be \$20/head, with the club funding the difference - of about \$15. This means if you paid your dues for 2019 and were attending the party - you more than got back your dues in this subsidy. It was decided that non-members or additional guests would be charged \$35 - roughly the cost to the club.

Mike Kowal was looking for input on dubious awards given annually and he club authorized him to purchase the solid-gold trophies. Roger T announced that he needed your ending mileage for the 2018 mileage contest as of 12/1/2018.

Bill Dudley pointed out that on-line payment for our dues was now available (huzzah! We're in the latter 20th Century!) and he promised to put in place - online payment for the holiday party.

We voted to donate \$300 to the Children's Hospital, as usual.

Prez Don opened the floor to the general public - and a suggestion was made that a member survey should be done in order to find out what members want from the club. Prez Don pointed out that a survey HAD been done - about a month before - and only 16 people bothered filling it in. Apparently one thing the members aren't interested in is filling in surveys.

Mention was also made about the NY moto show - with an astounding lack of interest by almost everyone. Apparently Dud e'fils e'son went - and a report is in this issue of the newsletter.

Meeting was adjourned at approximately 7:50PM after the drawing of the 50/50 ticket.


Holiday Party 2018

Javitts Motorcycle Show

On Sunday, Zhao, son William, and I went to the Javitt's MC Show. It was a crappy, rainy day. We took the bus from Lakewood, so at least we didn't have to drive in the awful weather.

The show was similar to previous years. There were big displays by BMW, Ducati, Honda, Kawasaki, Yamaha, Suzuki, and Royal Enfield, and slightly smaller displays by MV Agusta, Sling-shot, and probably some I've forgotten. Progressive Insurance had a large display that included two hair dressers, a tattoo artist, a pool table, and probably other stuff.

Zero motorcycles was there giving demo rides (indoors!) on a carpeted "track". They had a sign at the desk where one signed up for a ride that said (paraphrased) "For safety reasons, the bikes are limited to 12mph. Bikes you purchase will not have this limitation."

There were also custom motorcycles. They were god-awful.

The NY Classic Riders had a large-ish display of classic bikes -- airhead BMW's, British bikes, Japanese bikes -- lots of variety.






There was a "teach your child to ride a motorcycle" area, where small children could ride small electric bicycles around a track. Despite the potential for mayhem, this seemed to go quite well. We saw a very young boy, after extensive coaching by one of the instructors, manage to ride one of the bikes around the track. He looked to be maybe 4 or 5 years old.

As per past shows, there were the "local" vendors, selling eye-glass cleaner, patches, pins, shoe polish, chrome polish, socks, leather, and even actual useful motorcycle gear (jackets, pants, boots, helmets).

There were tour providers offering tours of Costa Rica, Panama, Ecuador, Thailand, Ireland (two providers), Vermont, and probably others I've forgotten. People were also flogging the Johnstown, PA rally (Thunder something-something), Americade, and some other rallies.
