

Breakfast Eats: Shore Good Pancake House

I had just finished exercising and burned through my light breakfast already. I was famished in Brick and brought up Yelp to help me. Cookie Lady, Taylor Sam's and Turning Point have been very good to me but I had a hankering to try something new. Shore Good Pancake House sure looked like a promising option.

I had some navigation problems and locating the restaurant was complicated by some not so good signage. It's located in the white building at the

Dorado Plaza by what looks like a commuter parking lot on Lanes Mill Road. Seems like a family runs the place. I just ordered coffee and a New Jersey omelet (bacon, tomato, cheese).

The potatoes were done right, lightly seasoned with freshly ground black pepper and salt. Such a small detail that was very evident in that first morsel of food made all the difference in how I perceived how these guys prepped their food. I was not inclined to believe the positive Yelp reviews until I put that first piece of potato in my mouth. The omelet was just as good. not overdone like in most places. Service was very good, with coffee refills and quick service (this is around 11am on a Monday).


The dining area is spacious and groups can easily be accommodated. They take credit cards and the parking lot is big. My one regret was that I didn't order pancakes.


