


Gathering of the Nortons

Club Breakfast and Martin Moto Ride

To say it was a great riding day on March 29 is an understatement: eighty to 84 degrees, sunny, no percept in sight, and light traffic. My route took me West on I-195 and then Rt-1 south and after a while, secondary roads northwest to Boyertown PA and the Martin Moto vintage bike show. The day started with our traditional Club

The Mug Rack is an excellent breakfast/lunch place with reasonable prices, substantial sized meals, and tasty too. Six of us attended: Robert Sherman, Paul Cooke, Joe Karol, Bill and Zhao Dudley, and me. Afterward Bill/Zhao and I headed toward the Martin Motorcycle vintage bike show while the rest of the folks went their independent merry way.

My Garmin VI was all cleaned out and loaded with super secondary roads to Boyertown. Then Bill said he was somewhat familiar with the area due to being over there for the recent Airheads Supertech session. So he loaded the Martin Moto destination into his trusty cell phone and off we went; I-195 to Trenton, across the Lower Trenton (metal) Bridge, then on to Route 1 south followed by a northerly chunk of I-476 and then secondary roads. Like I said, my route was more secondary roads off of Route 1. My GPS kept on yelling at me to turn right, turn left, make a U turn, recalculating, ... recalculating. Bill's and my trip equipment finally came into sync about a mile from Martin Moto when heading north on Rt 100 and after entering the parking lot. Next time I will just unplug by GPS or kill power to my communications system.

We parked in a lower lot which was a short uphill walk to the show. I have no idea how many bikes were there but at least 500 cluttered the parking areas and surrounding access roads. As soon as someone packed up and departed, another bike rolled in to the empty space. There was a lot of churn of people throughout the day

Example of one of the beautifully restored bikes: 1982 Krauser MKM1000 4-valve MC. Krauser was known since the early 1970s for its hard cases and racks. But Mike Krauser went well beyond equipment... as a racer, he enhanced the performance of BMW machines. Based on R100 engine, transmission and front forks, he and his team improved performance and wrapped the bike in a unique fiberglass fairing. Priced at twice the R100 price, only 200 were manufactured. MKM stands for Michael Krauser Motorcycles. This one is #65 and is on loan from Bob Henig's collection (Bob's BMW, Maryland).

The end result of the Club presidents numerous trips to Home Depot on the GSA have finally been revealed to the general public.

Those who have viewed the bike in person cite the Norm Abram level carpentry, carefully brushed Minwax "American Oak" stain, and hand carved "BMW" roundels. Those who have trailed the bike on recent rides do however report a high incidence of loose wood-screw induced flats.

No details yet as to whether the finish is bug resistant or holds up in severe downpours. The bike is expected to feature in PBS's "Antiques Roadshow" over the summer.
